FY 2005 Highlights: Major Gifts and Accomplishments

- The CDC Foundation marked its 10th Anniversary by celebrating a decade of heroes and a decade of helping CDC do more, faster. The celebration included a Tribute to Heroes dinner with guest speaker Rudy Giuliani, who was awarded the inaugural CDC Foundation Hero Award. Proceeds from the dinner totaled \$79,700.

- Wyeth Pharmaceuticals contributed \$3 million for a study to determine why some hemophilia patients do not respond to the drugs currently used to stop or prevent a bleeding episode.

- Sanofi-Aventis committed more than \$1 million for the development of workforce interventions for weight and tobacco control.

- James Hagedorn, CEO and chairman of the board of The Scotts Company, was elected to the Foundation's board of directors.

- Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health and the Global Alliance for Vaccines and Immunizations committed \$1.4 million to research pneumococcal infections among children and adults in Thailand.

- The CDC Foundation received \$500,000 from the settlement of a class action lawsuit against McDonalds to help CDC fight the obesity epidemic.

- The Foundation accepted \$965,000 from the settlement of a lawsuit against a tobacco company to implement a grant program for youth smoking reduction and prevention services in urban communities.

- In the wake of the December 2004 tsunami, the CDC Foundation established a new Global Disaster Response Fund to help meet the needs of CDC experts who travel to disaster-affected areas around the world. To date, contributions from many CDC Foundation friends and partners total approximately \$17,000. An additional in-kind gift valued at \$21,297 came from HP in the form of equipment for use in CDC's Marcus Emergency Operations Center.

- The Foundation received \$800,000 from Cargill, Inc. for two projects: a \$500,000 grant will support CDC's efforts to spread the use of fortified flour to reduce widespread anemia, death and developmental disabilities caused by nutritional deficiency in developing countries, and a second grant of \$300,000 will enable U.S. elementary schools to apply for mini-grants to improve physical activity and nutrition policies and programs.

- The CDC Foundation embarked on a strategic planning process that will map the course for the Foundation for the next three years.
